Let's expand our knowledge

Now that you know that addition is really just adding more to what you already have, you can start to add higher and higher numbers.

You should know that we only have 10 numbers in our entire number system. Count them:

That means that you are going to see patterns in the numbers once you start to add beyond 10. For instance:

$$2 + 2 = 4$$

$$12 + 2 = 14$$

$$2 + 12 = 14$$

$$3 + 4 = 7$$


$$13 + 4 = 17$$

$$4 + 13 = 17$$


$$4 + 5 = 9$$

$$15 + 4 = 19$$

$$4 + 15 = 19$$






